QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS: CHILDREN AND COVID-19

ARE CHILDREN AT A LOWER RISK OF COVID-19 THAN ADULTS

According to the World Health Organisation, children are less often reported as cases compared with adults and the illness they experience is usually milder. From data reported to WHO, children and adolescents up to 18 years of age represent 1 to 3% of reported infections, even this age group makes up 29% of the global population.

While children may be less affected, they may also have greater number of contacts in schools and community settings. Further studies are underway to assess the risk of infection in children and to better understand the transmission in this age group.

WHAT IS THE INCUBATION PERIOD FOR CHILDREN

The incubation period for children is the same as in adults. The time between exposure to COVID-19 and when symptoms start is commonly around 5-6 days and ranges from 1 to 10 days
